Directions: Redwing which is between River Rd. and Mass. Ave. is off Goldsboro Rd. and isn't on most maps. From the Beltway take the River Road exit toward Washington; at the 5th traffic light on River, turn right onto Goldsboro; at the 4th street, turn right onto Redwing; go to the top of the hill to 6404. From town go N.W. on Mass. Ave; about 2 miles past the D.C./Md. line Mass. Ave. forks - go right onto Goldsboro/ Highway 614; take first left onto Redwing.

P.V.S. ATTACKS KILLINGTON.....

Perhaps "invades" is the better word because Killington won't be the same after the week-end of March 22-23. The first 34 lucky PVSers (and guests) who apply will leave Friday the 21st after work, and return before dawn on Monday the 24th. There is a possibility that those who wish to can go to Pico Peak, too. The cost will be approximately \$60.00 and includes transportation, lodging, 2 breakfasts, 2 dinners, and lift tickets.

The details are these: 1.) We'll stay at the Deerbrook Lodge which is 9 miles north of Killington at Pittsfield. It is a motel - type lodge which will serve two breakfasts, Saturday dinner and Sunday night buffet. The cost is \$9.00 each per day for 4 to a room, Modified American and \$12.00 each per day for two to a room, Modified American. 2.) We'll leave by Greyhound bus at 7:00 P.M. Friday the 21st and return after dinner Sunday, arriving in the wee hours of Monday morning. This means you can sleep at your desk after two full days of skiing (and partying?) at Killington. 3) a \$25.00 deposit must accompany your application. 4.) We won't go unless there are at least 20 passengers - there were 16 signed up by Feb. 1.

If this seems expensive here is the breakdown: Bus and Lodging - \$31-\$40. (this includes that \$12.00 toll-road fee). Lift tickets - \$15. - \$17. Meals (4) - \$10 -\$15 Total - \$56-\$72 plus lunch and booze. B.Y.O.B. A full bus means a lower cost.

P.V.S. TAKES THIRD IN SCHAEFER CUP RACES.....
