THIS SATURDAY - JUNE 24th - STEAK & SWIM AT ELRODS

If you haven't called Elke Stecher to make your reservation for eating, drinking, swimming, and fun times, EO SO RIGHT NOW! The deadline is NOW! Elke's number is 762-9508. Here are the details to read while you're dialing 762-9508. The date you have - this Saturday, June 24th. The time is 3 p.m. until you're waterlogged either from the pool or the beer. Menu includes steak, baked potato, and tossed salad. The cost is maximum \$4 per person. (Or if you just want to drink beer and bring all your own food then the cost is \$1 per person.) Plates and cups will be provided but bring your own silver and steak knives. Here are the directions on how to get to 18315 Cendice Drive, Triangle, Virginia - that's where the Elrods live. From the Beltway, take Interstate 95 South towards Rickmond. Get off at the Dumfries-Manassas exit -- Rt. 234. Left on 234 to U. S. 1. Go right on U.S. 1 to State Rt. 1107, (sign Triangle Plaze). At Rt. 1107, also known as Graham Perk Road, take a left and go to the dead and. Here you angle right on Cabin Road. Take your second left to Candice Drive and lock for all the cars. Name is on mail box. In case you get lost, here is the phone: 221-7014.

PVS PLANNING FRENCH ALPS-TRIP - BOB WYCKOFF LEADER

Tentative plans have been made for an unusual two-weak trip (actually 17 days) to the French Alps, leaving Dulles on Air France February 16th and returning March 5, 1973. We'll fly to Geneva and proceed by chartered bus to Avoriaz for the first full week, and then on to Tigne for the second full week. On the second daturday, we'll fly to Paris for a two night stop-over, before flying directly back to Dulles, arriving about 2:30 p.m. Monday. Due to Washington's birthday being included only 10 days chargeable leave time is required.

This promises to be a memorable trip as these newly developed resorts are two of the greatest in Europe; and as both resorts are themselves over a mile above sea level, good snow conditions are a certainty. I've skied them both and can recommend them highly.

We'll arrive at Avoriaz from Morzine in the valley below by the fastest cable car in Europe. Here horse-drawn sleighs will meet us and take us to our comfortable first-class condominiums (with way-out architecture such as you've never seen). No cars are allowed in the resort. The skiing and scenery are great. The weekly ski pass is also good for both neighboring Champery and Val d'Illiez in Switzerland, connected with Avoriaz by ski lifts. The ski pass is also good for the swimming pool and other activities. We'll eat at a different restaurant or hotel each night, including going down to the quaint village of Morzine.

The second week we'll spend at Tigne, popularly called "Super-Tigne." This is the highest ski resort in Europe, its base elevation being 6,890 feet, and the peak of La Grande Motte glacier being 11,418 feet. Here they truly ski 365 days a year. It's one tremendous bowl in which you can follow the sun around during the day. And what a complex of lifts - 6 cable cars, 6 chairlifts, and 26 pomalifts. And, if that's not enough with its 120 miles of marked trails, you can ski over to neighboring Val D'Isere, Jean Claude Killey's home town, explore its almost equally fantastic complex, and ski back again the same day. Your lift pass is good at both resorts. I can't find appropriate words to describe it all -- you'll just have to come with us and see. Accommodations will again be in new condominiums, with meals being taken in various restaurants. I've learned the French really have earned their gournet cooking reputation.

After two weeks of skiing, we'll be ready for two days in Paris — to rest up??? Only breakfasts will be included in the package here. We may be able to get tickets for the famed Follies Bergere for the whole group for Saturday night. If we do, you'll remember this as a highlight of the trip I guarantee. Sunday is yours to sight see or rest.

Now as to cost — although these are two of the higher priced resorts, and this is right in the middle of "high season" when travel agents tell you you just can't get a group in, working through Air France, we've come up with what we consider a tremendous deal. Some details are still under negotistion so prices could change slightly. The Basic Package for 17 days including all air and ground transportation, all lodging, including the hotel in Paris, continental breakfasts, and a welcome cocktail party at each resort, is \$390. This is based on double occupancy of two rooms in each condominium, complete with bath, and is payable in three payments of \$130 each; the first due with your application, the 2nd on October 10, and the final one on December 10. If you cancel, there is a \$10 cancellation fee. Datails of late cancellations will be worked out later, but we believe they'll be more lenient than on charter trips.

In addition to the Basic Package, we strongly recommend a <u>DeLute Package</u>
Supplement for \$120 more. This includes weekly ski passes at each resort
(approximately an \$80 value), only two persons per apartment (large studio
type with private bath), and all dinners (except in Paria). With this supplement, payments would be \$170 each instead of \$130.

Fo broaden our base to make such a trip feasible, with forty as our planned number of participants, this trip will be run under sanction of the Federal Ski Council, which as you know our club joined last year. You must be a season of the Federal Ski Council (as all PVS members are) in good standing six months prior to flight time to be eligible. Sign up early to be sure you don't miss out. Just send a check for the appropriate amount made out to "FSC '73 French Alps Ski" to: R. L. Wyckoff, \$100 Park Crest Drive, Silver Spring, Md. 20910. Be sure to include full names and addresses of all applicants. Call Bob or Margaret Wyckoff, trip leaders at 589-5532 for more information.

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Mo forms are required. Just send your check to Elke Stecher, 4 Radburn Court, Rockville, Maryland 20850. Active - \$10, Spouse \$8, Junior \$3, Absentee - \$5, and Absentee Spouse - \$4. So write your check now while you're thinking about it.

SUMMATION OF USEASA CONVENTION Raiph Anderson

304 delegates, 115 alternates and 205 guests were in attendance
The Board of Directors voted acceptance of the committee report recommending the Headquarters of USEASA be moved from Littleton, N. H. The board requested an office be found in one of the 3 recommended towns of Hartford, Pittsfield, or Brattleboro ...

Continental N. American underwriters of the USEASA ski insurance have agreed to underwrite liability insurance covering all USEASA sanctioned events, imstructors, judges, etc. No definite decision was made to buy this coverage, but it appears that they will in the near future ... Membership packages are available for new clubs to let them know what they can expect from USEASA ... The Public Relations Committee urged that all members be publicity minded by sending in newsworthy items to the local media. Emphasis was placed on the skiers -- ecologists conflict of interest and it was pointed out that continuing effort will be needed to make the skiers point of view heard ... The role of the area councils to provide lisison between USFASA and the clubs was stressed ... Efforts will be made to work with manufacturers of ski equipment to establish some sort of "Approved" mark for ski equipment. Intentions are to develop and conduct lab tests on bindings. Results of an onthe-hill-binding-check were that only 12% of the bindings being worn were set in the correct range ... There were eleven flights to Europe last season carrying a total of 1,643 people ... Charlie Gibson is leaving the post of USSA president ... The 1973 On the Snow Weekend will be January 13-14 at Waterville, N. H. Package for room and board is \$56 ... General impression was favorable - that the USEASA Organization is dedicated to the interests of the skiers, and has 26 dedicated and experienced directors on the Board.
