PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I realize that it is SUMMER — and skiing concerns are far from most of our minds. However, from a Club By-Law point of view, one of the most significant events in the twelve year history of PVS has occurred. The Eastern Ski Association (ESA) has raised the amount PVS must pay to ESA for each member from \$5.00 to \$7.50 per year. While I am certain that ESA has a legitimate need for the additional funds, and that the new rate (ours is a 100% membership rate) is still only one-half the cost of an individual membership; I believe we must now re-evaluate PVS's 100% membership relationship in ESA.

Before we do reach a conclusion on this matter, I would like ALL of YOUR opinions on

the subject.

Whether we decide for or against 100% membership in ESA, we MLST change our By-Laws. An extract from our By-Laws on this subject is printed elsewhere in this issue of 7007. If we are to remain a 100% Club, we will have to increase our dues \$2.50 per year in all classes of membership (from \$15.00 to \$17.50, individual membership). If we stop being a 100% ESA Club, we should be able to LOWER our annual dues to about \$11.00 or \$12.00 per year, individual membership. We will also have to change other sections of our By-Laws, too; however, none of these changes will go into effect until next year.

Over the next several months, EXCOM and the membership will be considering this issue. We currently plan to bring the issue before the full membership for a vote at the September meeting. Prior to that, we want to talk to and with ALL INTERESTED MEMBERS. We want YOUR OPINION on this issue. Please call me on this subject any evening (Home: 790-8812). Or, tell any other officer or EXCOM member how you stand on the issue sometime this summer. We want

the FULL membership's opinion and participation in deciding this issue.

AND, Don't Forget; summer is now upon us. Come out and enjoy the many great Club Events we have scheduled (and some will be spontaneous and unscheduled) during the next few months.


SKI TRIPS 77-78

Recipe # 2 from the Eighth International Dinner: Marinated Mushrooms, by the McKinleys

Wash 2 lbs fresh mushrooms. If medium size, use whole; if large, cut in half. Add two packages of Good Season's Italian dressing mix. To that, add at least the amounts of water, oil and vintsgar which are recommended on the package. Mushrooms should be covered so recommend that more oil and vinegar be added. Use any vinegar which suits your taste—wine, cider or regular (McKinley Note: We used cider). Mix all together and let stand in refrigerator at least over night. Mushrooms are good for several months if they are not eaten first. In fact, recommend adding new mushrooms to the mixture from time to time.

Recipe # 3: Assorted Cheeses by Hank and Aina Thomas. Since this selection is very personalized, and so variable according to the event being hosted, 7007 merely refers readers to the abundent knowledge and experience in the person of Hank Thomas and suggests a half hour conversation with Hank will far surpass any small effort 7007 could muster in this short space. We're sure Hank will be happy to discuss this pleasant subject with any and all comers!

Recipe # 4: Hot German Potato Salad, by the Marx's.

Six medium to large potatoes, boiled in their skins, then peeled

6 slices of bacon, diced

3/4 cup chopped or thinly sliced onions

2 tablespoons flour 3 tablespoons sugar 1½ teaspoons salt

Chairladies:

f cup chopped celery or f teaspoon celery seed (or both)

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of water and 3/4 cup vinegar 2 dill pickles (if desired) chopped.

Fry bacon until crisp. Remove from pan and reserve about 1/3 cup fat. Cook onions in fat until yellow. Mix in flour, sugar, salt, celery seed and a dash of pepper. Stir in water and vinegar gradually. Pour over sliced potatoes, and add chopped celery and bacon. Mix thoroughly. Keep warm over hot water until ready to serve. May be made ahead and reheated over hot water or incovered casserole on oven at low heat.

'If you use 5 pounds of potatoes, double the other ingredients for the sauce. This would

be ample for 12 to 16 persons, depending upon their appetites.
