REPORT ON PSF FALL MEETING - Bob Wyckoff

Members in attendance at the Pennsylvania Ski Federation meeting September 24 had a busy and productive day. Forty-seven of the 60 clubs in the PSF were represented. Highlights:

-A PSF On-the-snow Weekend is planned for February 3 and 4. It will be a fun weekend at Charnita for all PSF clubs to get together, similar to the previous ones held at Waterville Valley.

-Discounts at participating ski areas, lodges and ski shops. PVS members have grumbled in the past that the discounts in USRASA coupon books were mainly of value to New England skiers. Bill Rakow, SCWDC, an Eastern Director, has asked the PSF Councils to cooperate actively in developing discount benefits for Kid-Atlantic Skiers. Volunteers are needed to contact participants in our Blue Ridge Ski Council area. Call Bill Anderson, Bill Rakow or Bob Hyckoff if you can help. Remember that any such program must be two-way --- when concessions are granted, we must patronize the areas, lodges or shops involved for the program to continue and to grow.

Charpita has already agreed to cooperate fully with the following discount package: Lift tickets, \$1 off every day, except one or two holiday weekends, on presentation of your Eastern membership card and one other piece of identification; a coupen good for two tickets for the price of one for one day during the season; Ski shop discounts of 5% on purchases up to \$100, 10% on purchases of \$101-\$200 and 15% for purchases over \$200.

-Ski Patrol Our region has 32 Ski Patrols and 742 patrolmen. They are actively promoting junior Patrolmen training to incure an adequate future supply; pioneering in advanced First Aid courses, beyond the regular Red Cross courses; emphasizing safety, including adjusting bindings and analyzing accident causes; and training patrolmen specifically for ski touring work.

QASI PROGRAMS Qualified Amateur Ski Instructor program and test will be conducted at Killington November 13-18 for qualified QASI Instructors. The Eastern Pennsylvania and Blue Ridge Ski Council QASI Program will be held Jan. 20-21 and Feb. 10-11 at Charnita. Contact Bob Crasley for more information.

-SAFFTY/RECREATION Rolf Dessauer solicits our trip leaders' cooperation in his committee; annual survey of Eastern ski areas. Was a particular lodge great or terrible? Were ski facilities in good condition? Snow reports accourate? At the end of the season he sends a compilation of all replies to participating clubs--a great help in planning future trips
