
#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The day was bright and sunny - but no snow in sight. The host club, The Bryce Mountain Ski Racing Club, held an all day Sunday meeting and did a fine job. Art Topping drove down the day before and reports good condominimum accommodations and some really fine food.

Two new clubs were admitted to BRSC membership - the Goddard Ski Club and the Crabtowne Ski Club (from Annapolis). Each have about one hundred members and each indicated an interest in running joint bus trips or other ski trips with clubs of equivalent size. (Trip Leaders - TAKE

# BRSC Fall Meeting Report (continued:)

SKI-O-REE is being sponsored by the Richmond Ski Club this year and plans are moving right along. It will be at Canaan Valley Ski area and Blackwater Falls State Park/Lodge on February 27, 28 and 29. A SKI-O-REE race will be run Saturday and A Schaefer Citizen Cup Race will be run on Sunday. Most participants race in both races. Lodging is \$9.00 a night at the Lodge; an available meal package includes Friday night snack, Saturday and Sunday breakfast, Saturday night buffet dinner and Sunday night box supper - all for \$16.25; lift fees will be \$7.00 per day for participants; the Registration fee covering mailings, name tags, trophies and a Saturday night wine and cheese party and dance is only \$4.00. A deposit of \$9.00 is required to hold lodging space. PVS needs a volunteer coordinator to handle the event for PVS members interested in going.

Regarding long range planning within BRSC, it was reported that Baltimore Ski Club, Ski Club of Washington, D.C., and the Richmond Ski Club are in touch with each other concerning 76-77 planning in an effort to coordinate major trips. This, of course, may benefit all member BRSC clubs.

Our own PVS member, larry Pease, who is the local Regional Director for the National Shi Patrol gave an interesting report on NSP activities and Shi Safety. The Patrol is investigating chair lift safety in depth and strongly recommending proper maintenance for all lifts, including chair lifts. Patrolmen and women get expert First Aid training and some achieve "Emergency Medical Technician" status, a status close to being a paramedic. Much patrol effort goes toward accident prevention through skier education, ski shop publicity, binding checks on and off the slopes, etc. In 500 checks conducted last year, the Patrol found 65% of skiers tested who had bindings set too tight; only 5% were too loose! How are YOUR bindings?? Incidentally, Larry states that both adults and juniors are wanted for Patrol participation. Interested individuals can call larry at 471-5334.

The last item to report was promotional commentary on the Octoberfest at the International Inn in Washington, D.C. November 7th at 8 P.M.
