

HAVE A LONGER SKI SEASON!

The 20th meeting at New Mark Commons Rec Hall will be both a seminar and a demonstration in the care of ski equipment. Some of our Ski Patrol members will show us how to prepare our skis for that first trip of the season, and how to keep them in proper condition for the entire senson. The topics that will be covered are: 1) The SYSTEM -- boot, binding and shi; 2) Boot Care to achieve proper control in relation to your shill level; 4) The Shi Base and where it lives; and 5) Edges and How To Maintain Them.

This is going to be a working session, so bring your equipment if you want to have it fixed up by the experts; or, if you want to learn to do it yourself (and avoid those costly shop charges). Working on skis can be dirty work, so we suggest you bring coveralls or an apron. A 10-inch mill bastard file (or targer will be useful for sharpening edges-most of ours will need it for local conditions this winter). Boots will be needed

for binding adjustment.

Bring what you wish, but be sure to come; and see and learn how you can be sure to have a Longer and safer season.

### INTERNATIONAL DINNER RECIPES

HALUPKI (Russian)

1 15 hamburger

½ cup cooked rice
1 onion – chopped
1 egg
salt & pepper

1 small cabbage - steamed - remove leafs as they become soft and pliable.

Put meat mixture in leaf to 2/3rds filled, noll and tuck in ends.

Place cut of torn cabbage piece in bottom of pan (roasier), then add your stuffed cabbage rolls, toosely packed. Pour over - one large can of tomato juice and 1 can tomato soup. Place a few pieces of bacon over the rolls and cook or bake over medium heat for one hour, or until done. DO NOT BOIL. Serves approximately 8.
