The National Handicapped Sports and Recreation Association (NHSRA) is conducting a "Learn to Ski" clinic for the physically disabled at Hidden Valley Ski Area near Pittsburgh, PA, January 15-18,1987. The clinic is one of 8 such clinics being held nationwide.

As well as provide instruction to individuals with physical disabilities, the clinic will teach instructors who wish to be come proficient in adaptive skiing techniques.

NHSRA was founded in 1967 by a group of Vietnam veterans to provide an opportunity for the war injured to become active and productive members of society through participation in sports and recreation activities. Today, NHSRA serves 10,000 physically disabled veterans and non-veterans annually through a network of 55 chapters in 31 states.
