WHAT A LUAU!!! As usual the food was fantastic, the ambience terrific, the socializing fun and the host and hostess dressed

in full island regalia. Selections from the evening are presented for your cooking and eating enjoyment.

COCONUT CURRY SHRIMP DIP

Mix well and chill for several hours:

- 1 cup sour cream

- 1 teaspoon curry powder

- 1/2 cup finely chopped coconut

1/4 teaspoon salt

- 2 finely chopped green onions

- 1/4 cup small cooked shrimp

- Dash tabasco

Dash black pepper

Serve with crackers or vegetables. Janet doubled the recipe to serve 36 people and used I (4 1/4 oz) can Chicken of the Sea Shrimp.

TERIYAKI CHICKEN, HAWAIIAN STYLE

-6 boneless chicken breasts

Combine all marinade ingredients:

- 1 cup soy sauce

- 1 cup pineapple juice

- 1 Tablespoon sugar

- 1 teaspoon ginger (dry or fresh)

- 1 clove garlic, crushed

- 1/2 cup white wine

- 2 Tablespoons salad oil

Pour just enough over chicken breasts to cover completely. Reserve rest in separate container in fridge. Marinate 24-48 hours. Grill over hot coals and place in deep pan.

Heat reserved marinade in pan to boil. Add 1 cup crushed pineapple. Mix:

- 2 Tablespoons cornstarch

- 1/2 cup water Add to liquid stirring while it thickens.

Pour liquid over chicken in pan. Cook in 350° oven for 30 minutes. Serves 8. (Janet prepared 6 times the recipe.)

SUMI SALAD

Toast and set aside:

- 2 Tablespoons oil

- 1/4 cup sliced almonds

- 1/4 cup sesame seeds

Mix together:

8 green onions, finely sliced
 1 head cabbage, finely grated

- 2 (3oz) packages Ramen noodles, uncooked

Dressing:

- 1/4 cup sugar

- 6 Tablespoons rice vinegar

- 3/4 cup oil

- 3 Tablespoons sesame oil

1 teaspoon salt

Toss all ingredients and chill several hours (at least 6 hours). Serves 10-12.

For a different but similar salad, add the seasoning packet from the noodles to the dressing. Hold the noodles until just before serving and crush over the top of the cabbage mixture.

HUKILAU SALAD

(Creamy coconut gelatin salad. Hukilau means "party" in Hawaiian.)

In small pan, sprinkle:

- 2 envelopes unflavored gelatin

- 1 1/2 cups water

Let gelatin set until softened. Stir over low heat until gelatin dissolves. Set aside.

In blender bowl, blend and pour into bowl:

- 1 (24 oz.) carton cottage cheese

Add and mix well:

- 1 can sweetened condensed milk

- 1 (8 oz.) package cream cheese

- 1 cup coconut

- 1/2 teaspoon almond extract

- Reserved gelatin mixture from above

Refrigerate until slightly thickened, about 10 minutes. Stir and put in oiled mold or oiled serving dished.

Garnish with colored cake sprinkles for a festive look. Serves 12-18. Janet doubled for Luau.
