

Free parking in Crystal City on the street and in garages on weekends. Our condo parking area is available for those with difficulty walking – contact us if you need us to get you a permit.

Northbound in VA via 395 North

From 395 Northbound, take Exit 8C (Route 1 South – Alexandria). Stay in the left middle lane and merge straight onto Hayes Street. Pass the Pentagon City Mall on your right and keep straight following road around as it becomes 18th St. to Crystal City. 18th Street comes to an end on Crystal Drive just facing our driveway. Our building is 1805 – the right of two matching buildings. Park for free on the street or in the garage at 2011 Crystal Drive (Number 8 on the map). Do not park in the condo parking lot without a permit.


Eastbound in VA from Route 66

Take Exit 75 (Route 1 South – Alexandria). Merge onto Route 110/Route 1 South. Route 110 will end and continue as Route 1 South into Crystal City. Immediately as you merge onto Route 1 South, take the first right exit for 15th Street. At light at bottom of ramp, turn left onto 15th Street. 15th Street will end at Crystal Drive. Turn right onto Crystal Drive and go straight until 18th Street. The driveway to our building – number 1805 -- is on the left at the corner of 18th and Crystal Drive. Number 1805 is the second of the two matching buildings. Park for free on the street or in the garage at 2011 Crystal Drive (Number 8 on the map). Do not park in the condo parking lot without a permit.

Southbound from MD via 495 and GW Parkway

From 495 take Exit 43 for the George Washington Parkway. On southbound GW Parkway, take the Exit for “Reagan National Airport.” Stay in the right lane and turn right onto Abington Drive. Follow signs for US1 – Crystal City. Take the right exit ramp for Crystal Drive and continue onto Crystal Drive toward 18th St. To park in a garage, use the parking garage at 2011 Crystal Drive (Number 8 on the map) at the light at 20th Street which is a block before you come to our driveway at 18th St and Crystal Drive. Or park for free on the street. Number 1805 is the second of the two matching buildings at 18th and Crystal Drive. Do not park in the condo parking lot without a permit.

METRO – the Crystal City METRO stop comes up onto the street at 18th St. one block from our condo at 18th Street and Crystal Drive. At the top of the METRO escalator, make a hard left turn, walk downhill to the corner of 18th and Crystal Drive and cross Crystal Drive into the driveway of our building – 1805 – the second of two matching buildings facing you.

Trip Details

Once again we will be staying [slope-side at the Snowmass Mountain Chalet \(SMC\)](#), just below the Snowmass Mall and from where you can ski directly to the lifts. Check the website at www.mountainchalet.com. This year we are offering a **“Land Only”** package since most people prefer to make their own arrangements. The total package includes: land transfer from Aspen airport to SMC and return; 5 day lift ticket ([good for all four ski areas in the Aspen complex, free shuttle bus](#)) with option for extra days; 7 nights lodging (double occupancy); daily breakfasts; daily soup lunch; luggage handling; a welcome reception, an “all guest” hotel sponsored party, a “pizza” party and a farewell group dinner to celebrate our trip. Additional nights at Snowmass are an option **based on availability**. Trip insurance is available through Encompasse Tours and is [highly suggested](#).

SKI TALK

JANUARY 2017

As I start thinking about my first ski trip this year, the usual concerns arise. Do I remember how to ski? What should I pack? What should I remember about group ski trips? The first thing I do is pull out my old ski video “Breakthrough on Skis 3” by Lito Flores for a reminder of how to ski. Then I look at my ski gear and clothes and try to figure out how to pack and how to get my skis to the destination. I have tackled these problems in past Ski Talk columns and am going to repeat some of my suggestions.

To pack efficiently, you have to plan ahead. Think about what you really need and what you will wear each day. Try to minimize bulk. A whole industry has developed to sell travel/ski clothes that wash easily, dry quickly and are wrinkle free. Many of the new technical pieces are very lightweight but warm. Invest in a few such pieces, and you will be able to travel lighter.

Next, think of what you are carrying on the plane. Are you going to use it on the plane? Do you really need to carry all that through the airport and on to a plane with almost no free overhead space? Don't burden yourself unnecessarily. Try to have one carry on that you can easily manage. I find a backpack to be light and efficient.

You might want to consider renting skis or sending them ahead. We have been shipping our skis for years by FedEx. We use a double ski bag and take them to the Fed Ex office at least a week before we plan to arrive at our destination. Send them via “Ground” for the lowest price. You can pack your ski boots in your duffle bag with your clothes. Try using compression bags. You can wear your heaviest clothes for traveling. One coat can suffice for skiing and for the evening.

On PVS ski trips, our leaders are volunteers and spend several months organizing the trip. While they may get “comps” such as a free room or air, often they do not. As a club, each member needs to be invested in making our trips as smooth as possible. Some things you can do to help are:

1. Get to know other group members;
2. Let people know what your skiing level is and invite others to ski with you;
3. Volunteer to help the leader set up or clean up at a social event;
4. Help set up lunch “meet ups” on the mountain;
5. If you find an interesting excursion, dinner place, or ski area, take the initiative and invite others to go with you;
6. If you notice someone has a particular problem, let the leader know;
7. Always be respectful of your fellow ski members.

I look forward to seeing many of you at Snowmass. I hear the snow there is spectacular this year.



LOCAL SKIING by John Smith

December 20th update: Both Liberty Mountain and Whitetail are now open and have been making snow the last few days. They are still able to make snow today. After today, the temperature at both places is expected to be continuously above freezing for the next ten days; so it may not be possible to continue to make more snow. There has been no natural snow so far this season.



Liberty Mountain has 10 trails and six lifts open today, with a snow base of 15 to 20 inches. Whitetail has nine trails and six lifts open today, with a snow base of 15 to 20 inches. Next week doesn't look too promising because it is expected to rain on Saturday, Tuesday, and Thursday and not be cold enough to make snow very often.

December 28 update: Both Liberty and Whitetail remain open with manmade snow, but not made recently, because of the warm temperatures and rain. After January 5, it looks more hopeful.

In memoriam: Roy H. Elrod, June 23, 1919 - December 17, 2016

Roy Elrod was 97 when he died peacefully at his home in Fredericksburg, VA, on December 17, 2016. Roy and his wife, Malda, who died in 2008, are former, longtime PVS members. They hosted many of the Steak and Swim events at their Quantico, VA, home in the 1980s and were avid and expert skiers.

Roy grew up in Texas where he and Malda were high school sweethearts. Roy attended Texas A&M for two years, until World War II broke out, at which time he enlisted in the Marine Corps. Roy's time in the Marines was spent in the Pacific in fierce combat. He fought at Guadalcanal where he was awarded a Silver Star, on the beaches of Tarawa, and in Saipan where he was awarded a Purple Heart. He and Malda married upon his return from the war in 1944. Roy made a career of the Marine Corps and retired as a Lt. Col. in 1961.

After Roy's retirement, Roy and Malda formed a construction and development company building hospitals, schools, and other developments in the metro area until 1994. They also made three trips around the world.

Jan Marx and Margaret Wyckoff offer the following reminiscence: Roy was a building contractor, and he and Malda built three houses through the years and made sure that each had a pool so they could host Steak and Swim over many years. They were true Texans and served the best steaks. They had their Texan hats and Roy often sported one of his many bolo ties. They were beautiful skiers and participated in many PVS ski trips.




Applicant Member - Bruce King Profile:
