Directions from the Beltway: Take the Dulles Toll Road (Route 267) west to the Wiehle Avenue exit. Turn left onto Wiehle Avenue. Wiehle Avenue ends in a tee at Sunrise Valley Drive. Turn right onto Sunrise Valley. Go 0.4 miles to left onto Soapstone. Take the second left onto Purple Beech (first left is Durand Drive). Take your first right onto Eakins Court. 2054 is straight ahead in the cul-de-sac. There is a green mailbox by the driveway. NOTE: parking is limited on Eakins Court so consider parking on Purple Beech. (Another option is taking the new Silver Line metro to the Wiehle Avenue stop and either taking a taxi or walking the two miles to our house.)

HIKE AROUND CLOPPER LAKE THURSDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2014

Join us for a leisurely four-mile hike around Clopper Lake at Seneca Creek State Park, Gaithersburg, MD, on Thursday, October 9, starting at 10.00 am. The walk will be followed by a lunch at the Fontina Grille in Rockville. If you cannot make the hike, then please join us for the lunch so everyone can catch up on each other's summer activities. We will meet at the Fontina Grille at 12.45 pm.



Directions to the hike:

From the Beltway, exit onto 270 N and then take exit 10 toward MD-117 W, which becomes Clopper

Road. The entrance to Seneca Creek State Park is to your left. Pass the gatehouse (unattended), turn right at the T intersection, and go left at the sign for the playground (with restrooms) and the boathouse. There is ample parking at the playground parking lot. Following the easy hike over rolling terrain with scenic vistas of the lake, we will head for lunch at 12:45 pm at the Fontina Grille in the King Farm Village Center.

Directions to the Fontina Grille from Clopper Lake:

From Seneca Creek State Park head back to 270 S and take the Shady Grove exit and stay right. After 0.3 mile, turn right on Gaither Road; go 0.5 mile and turn left on King Farm Blvd. After 0.1 mi, see Fontina Grille on the left at Pleasant Drive, and park on the street. 801 Pleasant Drive, Rockville, MD 20850. NATIONAL HARBOR - FERRIS WHEEL RIDE AND HIKE

Friday, October 24



The new Capital Ferris Wheel at National Harbor is a sight to behold. It is built at the end of a pier on the edge of the water. There are 42 enclosed, climate-controlled cabins making it a very comfortable ride. As you soar 180 feet above the Potomac River waterfront, you will marvel at the incomparable views. Sights visible include the White House and Capitol, the National Mall, Arlington Cemetery, City of Alexandria, Prince George's County, the Wilson Bridge and the lush parklands throughout the DC-Maryland-Virginia region. Join us for this exciting urban hike to National Harbor from Alexandria. We will park our cars at Jones Point under the Wilson Bridge and leave from there at 10:30am, so come a little earlier to have time to park. From there, we will proceed to the entrance of the bridge. There is a 12-foot wide pedestrian/bike path on the north span of the Wilson Bridge. The path is wider than the typical bike path and there are three rest areas equipped with telescopes where you can

stop and enjoy fantastic views of Washington and Alexandria. It is approximately 2.5 miles from the entrance of the path on S. Washington St. in Alexandria to National Harbor (add another 0.2 mile from parking lot). We will stop and look at the views from the bridge. Once at National Harbor, we will see the statue "The Awakening" at its new home and then proceed to the Capital Ferris Wheel. After riding on the Ferris Wheel, we will go to lunch at one of the many places at National Harbor. Then we will hike back to our cars at Jones Point – another 2.5+ miles.

10:30am at Jones Point 11:30am at the Ferris Wheel

Cost: Ferris Wheel is \$15 Adult: \$13.50 Senior 65+

Jones Point Park is directly under the Wilson Bridge on the southern end of Old Town Alexandria, VA

If you are coming from the north (from D.C.)

Take Washington Street through Old Town
Turn left on Green St.
Turn right on S. Royal St.
At the end of the road, turn left on Jones Point Road
The destination is on your left; park in designated parking spaces.

If you are coming from the south on Washington St. Turn right on Green St. and follow above directions.

If you are coming on the Beltway, inner or outer loop, Exit to Alexandria/Rt. 1 north
Take the first right turn to Jefferson St.
Turn right on S. Royal St.
At the end of the road turn left on Jones Point Road
The destination is on your left.

Best way to get there is to plug Jones Point Park into your GPS and it should lead you there.

If you prefer to drive to National Harbor and just do the Capital Wheel and lunch, then that will work, too. We should be at the Wheel around 11:30. Each person will buy his or her own ticket for the Capital Wheel ride. You can do this online or when we arrive. Have a credit card. No cash is accepted. A lunch place will be determined when we know how many people are going.

SKI TALK October 2014

As we approach the ski season, it is time to think about your gear, your technique and the shape you are in. Take inventory of what you have. Do you want to upgrade anything? See below for some hints. Do your skis need to be



tuned? Do it early before the shops get too busy. Are you satisfied with your skiing? If not, you might consider taking a lesson this year. Are you fit and in shape? Continue to work on that.

There is always new gear coming on the market. Be sure to go to our November meeting at the Washington Ski Center to hear the store manager, Brian Eardley, discuss the latest in gear. The latest issue of SKI Magazine rates the best new skis and boots, and notes that fat skis (82-100cm) are still popular for 'All Mountain Skiing.'

Here are some tips for "How to Buy Women's Skis."

Communicate Your Terrain Preference: Women typically want only one pair of skis; so, it is really important to let the salesperson know what type of terrain you want to ski.

Specialty Ski Shop: Avoid large all-activity sports stores. Go to a ski shop where the staff is well trained and knows their products.

Go Narrower: Men tend to tell the salesperson what their significant others want – and it is usually similar to

what the men own. Speak up for yourself. Women are shorter and smaller, and we usually don't ski with our feet as far apart as men. Wider skis do not edge as well for women as men.

Don't Overthink It: Remember all the skis now are really good. If you have demoed a ski and like it, don't let someone tell you to try something else. Follow your gut.


Buy Longer: Shorter skis create less stability and less confidence. Because women are more likely to understate their level of ability, they are often sold skis that are too short!



One new piece of gear I have been reading about is the Italian made **Osbe Helmet**, which has a built-in visor that replaces goggles. According to Billy Kidd, this is the way to

improve comfort and peripheral vision. According to my research, the visor does offer excellent vision. It has a rose lens and because the side-to-side lens span is so wide, it has superior peripheral vision compared to regular goggles. However, the visor does not fit snugly on your face, and your face and eyes are not totally protected; on a cold, windy day, the cold air coming under the visor is not comfortable. You can customize the fit of the visor to your face with additional

foam padding from OSBE. However, it sounds like this is a bit awkward to do. I have not tried this new system; so, if anyone has, please let me know what you think.

PVS/BRSC SKIING AND SIGHTSEEING ADVENTURE MT. BACHELOR AND BEND, OREGON JANUARY 31-FEBRUARY 7, 2015

Mt. Bachelor is the largest ski area in central Oregon, with terrain for all levels. The mountain is an extinct volcano, and you can ski with full lift service 360 degrees off the top for 3,365 vertical feet to the base, often through light, dry powder! It has the highest skiable elevation of any resort in Oregon or Washington and is far enough inland for drier snow conditions. The resort gets an average of 462 inches of snow a year on 88 runs, served by 10 lifts. (Mt. Bachelor is adding over 400 acres of ski terrain that is scheduled for opening in 2015). In addition, the resort has more than a dozen cross-country trails, 35 miles of which are groomed. The mountain grooms 40 of the 88 runs. Volunteer Mountain Hosts will ski with you all or part of the day, at your request.



The mountain is a 30-minute bus ride from Bend where you will be staying in the newly upgraded Double Tree Hotel. There is an indoor pool and hot tub. You can walk to the historic downtown district of Bend with lots of shops and restaurants. Buses will pick you up at the hotel and take you directly to the mountain where you will store your skis. No long walks are involved. Non-skiers will have options to go to Crater Lake, the town of Three Sisters, wine tasting, dog sledding, snowshoeing and more. Included in this package are:

September Wine Tasting

At four o'clock on September 27, 2014, 13 of us gathered at the home of Marianne Soponis and Clare Soponis. Marianne had arranged for an intriguing guest, Michael Alsup, to present a short course on value wines from Trader Joe's. Michael, former Trappist monk, former defense contractor, and now self-taught wine guru, told us about and had us taste six wines, but taught us much more about wine in We tasted Cremant de Bourgogne, Brut Reserve (refreshing), Veramonte Sauvignon Blanc (bright and citrusy), Revelation Chardonnay (smooooth, but not too oakey), Cline Zinfandel (big and bold), Tertre du Moulin, Saint Emillion Grand Cru (I liked it a lot!), and Chevalier Sauternes (not your mother's sauternes). We enjoyed every swirl and swallow along with 1,000 Day Gouda and a creamy Brie. What did we learn? Every wine has natural sulfites, but avoid wines that are labeled "sulfites added," Trader Joe's has the finest selection of value wines in the area, watch the films "Bottleshock" and "Somm," and check out Karen McNeil's The Wine Bible.
