

Summerfest at Windridge Vineyards



SKI TALK - June 2021

Kerry Hines, Barry Lake, and I attended the Blue Ridge Ski Council (BRSC) spring meeting by Zoom on May 1. Representatives from twenty clubs in the Metropolitan area, Baltimore, and Richmond attended. The pandemic certainly impacted everyone. The BRSC 2021 trips to Telluride, Davos and Jay Peak were all cancelled. Although some clubs did send members to Telluride, it was difficult finding lodging.

There was discussion about the upcoming BRSC trips:

- **2022** Western Carnival Jackson Hole While PVS is not going as a club, our members can sign up for the trip with another club. Seven clubs (Baltimore, Columbia, Frederick, Fredericksburg, Mogul, SCWDC, and Snow Searchers) are signed up. Most are staying at the 49er, with two clubs booked at the Elk Country. The Snow King is still available. BRSC events will be at the Snow King. There will be an optional Tuesday trip to Grand Targhee. Jackson Hole is an IKON resort and passes may be purchased through Winter Ski and Sport (WSS). January 29-February 5, 2022.
- 2022 Eurofest Sölden, Austria Only two clubs (SCWDC and Fredericksburg) have signed up for this trip. BRSC is concerned over the lack of club participation. Unless there is more interest, the trip may have to be cancelled. Understanding that some clubs were hesitant to book Europe, BRSC developed the idea of the BRSC Club Mix as a way to stimulate participant interest. So, while PVS is not participating in this trip, our members can book directly with Winter Ski and Sport. See flier below.



2022 Winterfest Jay Peak - The 2022 trip will take place March 6-11, a Sunday through Friday trip with a 4-day lift pass included. The trip includes 5 nights lodging at the Stateside Lodge and, if needed, there are also 2-bedroom cottages available. The venue is ski in/ski out with a Monday night Welcome Party, a Wednesday Après Ski Party and a Thursday Farewell Party. There will be 2 buses, a northern bus and a southern bus. Presently pick-up locations are the Columbia Fire House, The Baltimore White Marsh Mall and the Ashland area. The Tysons area is another possibility. The 56 Passenger bus will be limited to 40 people. There is also a U-drive option. Baltimore, Peninsula, and Columbia are signed up.

Western Carnival Venue Selection 2023

Crested Butte was chosen as the venue for Western Carnival 2023.

• Eurofest Venue Selection 2023

Val d'Isere, France or another Club Med option in France was chosen as the venue for Eurofest 2023.

PVS 2022 trip to Snowmass.

PVS is going to Snowmass next January but will not have the final details for a few more weeks. The Mountain Chalet has been sold back to the original owners who also run the Mountain Chalet in Aspen. The sale has just been finalized and the new owners are not yet taking reservations for next season. In the meantime, we have a back-up hotel just in case they decide not to open as usual. PVS' BYOB (Bring Your Own Book) group met on May 13 to share their latest captivating reads and to talk about books on our ever-expanding reading wish lists. See the info at the bottom for how to join us on June 10th at 4 pm!

Here are the books we shared in May:

- Dorian **Janney** brought us "Black Death at the Golden Gate" by David Randall which tells of the efforts to save the US from an outbreak of the black plague in 1899. This non-fiction account details the public health challenges that continue today.
- Lexie Armao has been reading "Secrets of a Charmed Life" by Susan Meissner, a fictional tale of 2 sisters separated during WWII in England. Lexie also noted Anita Shreve's "The Stars are Fire" and "Sea Glass."
- Louann **Eadie** noted her fondness for the character of Inspector Gamache in the murder mysteries by Louise Penny set in Quebec, in this case "The Cruelest Month." She also mentioned mysteries set in Venice by Donna Leon.
- Mary Ellena Ward has been engrossed in a trilogy set in the environs around her home in Lexington, VA. "To the Valley" by Kenneth Jewett (whom Mary Ellena has met) uses his family and actual figures to pull together works of historical fiction.
- Marianne Soponis has been reading "Moonflower Murders" by Anthony Horowitz which focuses on events in England and the complicated story of not one but two murders to be solved.
- Jan Marx told us about another of Louise Penny's stories taking place in Three Pines, Quebec, this one titled "All the Devils are Here." Inspector Gamache is at it yet again!
- Nancy McKinley brought her interest in her family history to her reading of "Chesapeake" another of James Michener's tomes linking generations over hundreds of years, this time primarily on the Eastern Shore of Maryland and Virginia.
